DETAILED CROSSING ACTIVITY

Overall, **484 truckloads (12,413 tons)** were unloaded at the crossings.

192 Int. Org. staff members entered Israel.

213 Int. Org. staff members entered the Gaza Strip.

373 patients and accompanying individuals crossed into Israel and the West Bank.

353 truckloads (**7,376** tons) were imported to the Gaza Strip.
